
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#### Gloucester's background

#### 2010

#### 2013

- ► Funding from PCT
- ► Still got funding from PCT
- ▶ 8 trained Helpers
- ▶ 30 trained Helpers
- ► Volunteers in 5 local (active) Children's Centres
  - ▶ Volunteers in 13
- ▶ No trained Supporters local Children's Centres
  - ▶ 12 trained Supporters (active)

## Getting in touch with mums

#### 2010

- ► About 2 antenatals each month
- ► Collecting mums' details in hospital
- Not able to provide any bedside support in hospital
- ▶ About 15 home visits a month

### 2013

- ▶ About 9 antenatals each month
- ▶ Still collecting mums' details in hospital
- Providing bedside
  support in hospital on
  6 days each week
- ► About 30 home visits a month

#### Developing the antenatals



2 sessions per month has become 9 sessions per month

Expanded into more Children's Centres

Developed a standardised "FEELY BAG" and "WHAT'S IN
